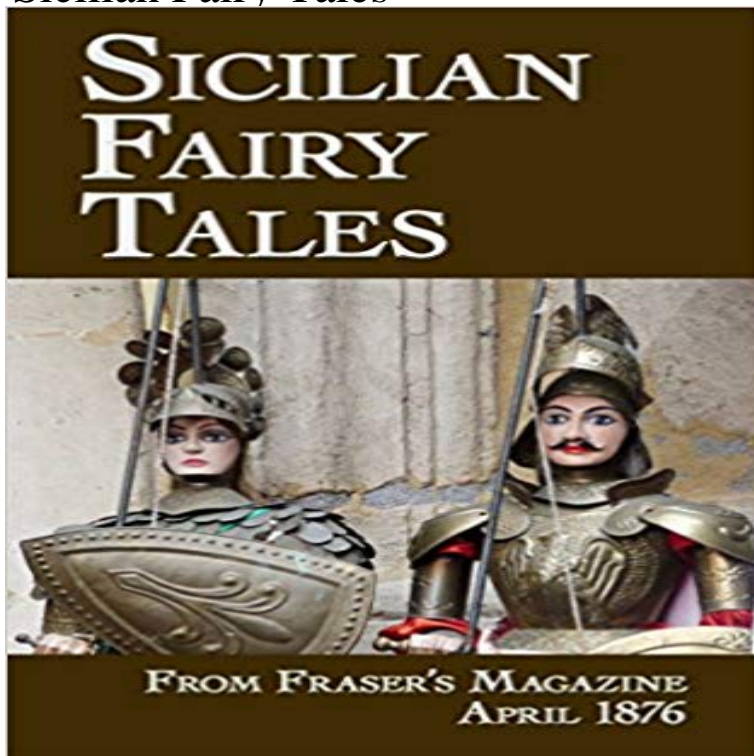


Sicilian Fairy Tales
