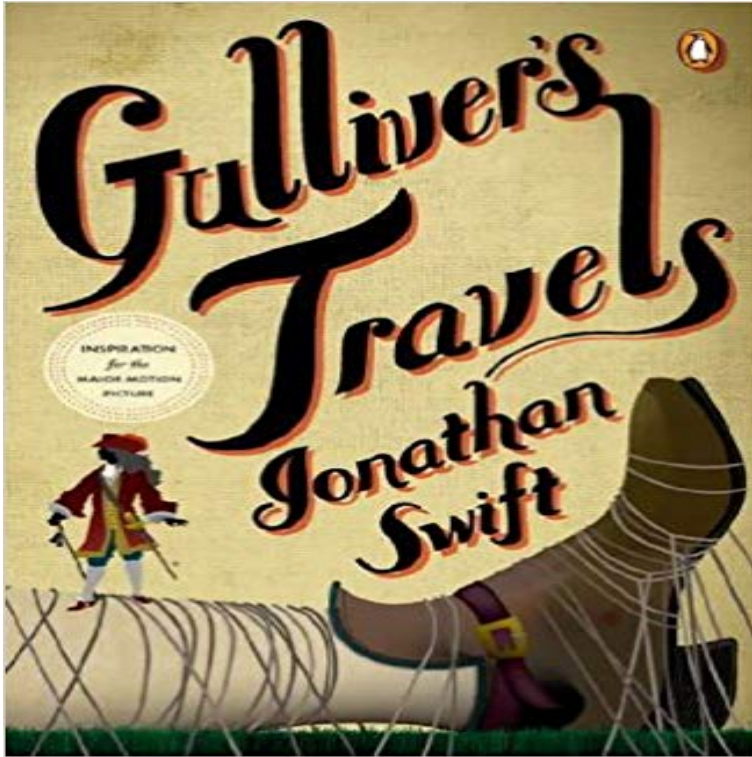


Gullivers Travels



It is universally read, from the cabinet council to the nursery, remarked Alexander Pope when Gullivers Travels was published in 1726. One of the unique books of world literature, Swifts masterful satire describes the astonishing voyages of one Lemuel Gulliver, a ships surgeon, to surreal kingdoms inhabited by miniature people and giants, quack philosophers and scientists, horses endowed with reason and men who behave like beasts. Written with great wit and invention, Gullivers Travels is a savage parody on man and his institutions that has captivated readers for nearly three centuries. The Modern Library has played a significant role in American cultural life for the better part of a century. The series was founded in 1917 by the publishers Boni and Liveright and eight years later acquired by Bennett Cerf and Donald Klopfer. It provided the foundation for their next publishing venture, Random House.
