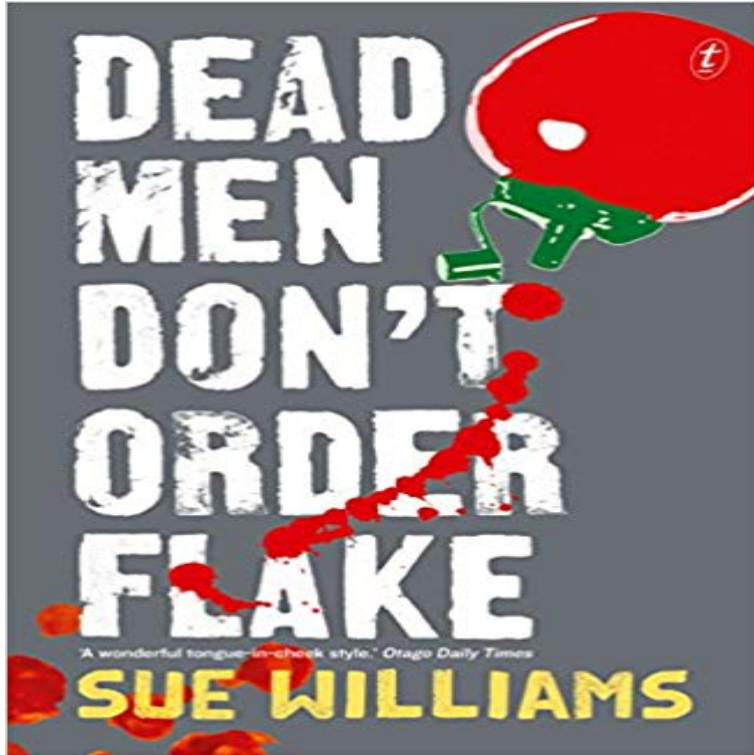


## Dead Men Dont Order Flake
