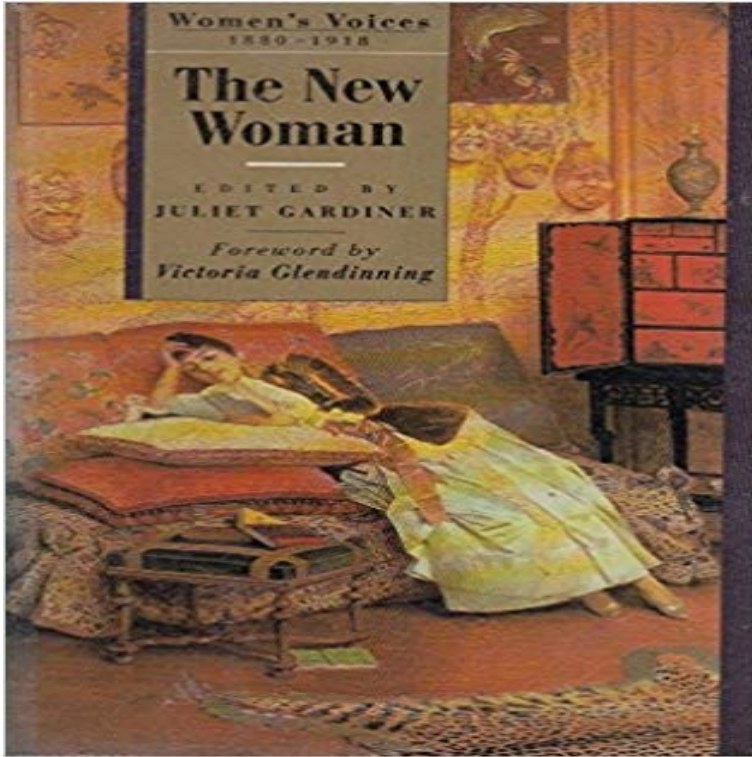


The New Woman: Womens Voices 1880-1918

It includes diaries, letters, pamphlets, memoirs and fiction. Featuring the work of well-known and lesser-known women writers, poets and activists, such as Emmeline, Christabel and Sylvia Pankhurst, Eleanor Marx, the youthful Rebecca West, Dame Ethel Smythe and Ethel Glyn, the book also gives voice to the experiences of the ordinary women with very different lives as it reflects the hesitant march towards emancipation.
