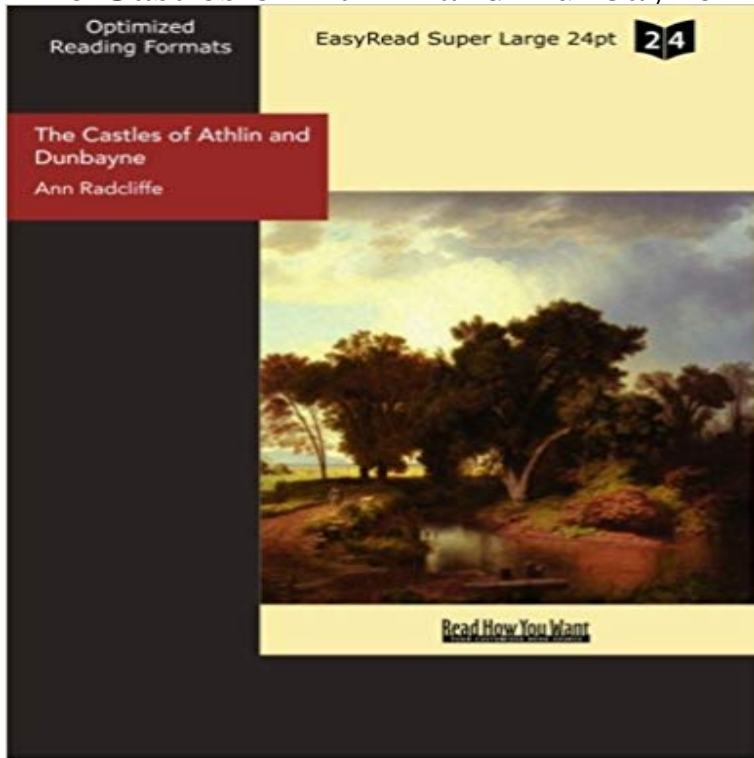


# The Castles of Athlin and Dunbayne
